

WHY USE MEDICATION DROP-BOX?

Improve Public Health

Throwing unused or unwanted medications in the trash, or leaving them out, can lead to dangerous unintended exposure to people or animals. Treat and store both prescription and over-the-counter drugs like any other poison.

Protect the Environment

Studies have found traces of different pharmaceuticals in wastewater throughout the United States. Do NOT flush or pour medications down the a drain or sink.

Increases Public Safety (2015 statistics)

- In the US alone, more than 15 million people abuse prescription drugs. (1)
- 52 million Americans over the age of 12 have used prescription drugs non-medically in their lifetime. (2)
- In a survey, almost 50% of teens believe prescription drugs are much safer than illegal street drugs. (1)
- Nearly 9 out of 10 poisoning deaths are caused by drugs- both illicit and prescribed. (3)
- 54.2% of prescription drug users get them free from a friend or relative. (2)
- Medical emergencies resulting from prescription drug abuse increased 132% over the last seven years, with opioid involvement rising 183%. (3)

- Over-the-counter & prescription medications
- Creams, liquids or lotions should be left in original containers; remove personal information on label
- Inhalers
- Pet medications

NOT ACCEPTED

- Radioactive Chemo Drugs or IV bags
- NO SHARPS: Needles or syringes
- Non-medicated items: i.e. personal care products (lotions, shampoo)
- Vitamins
